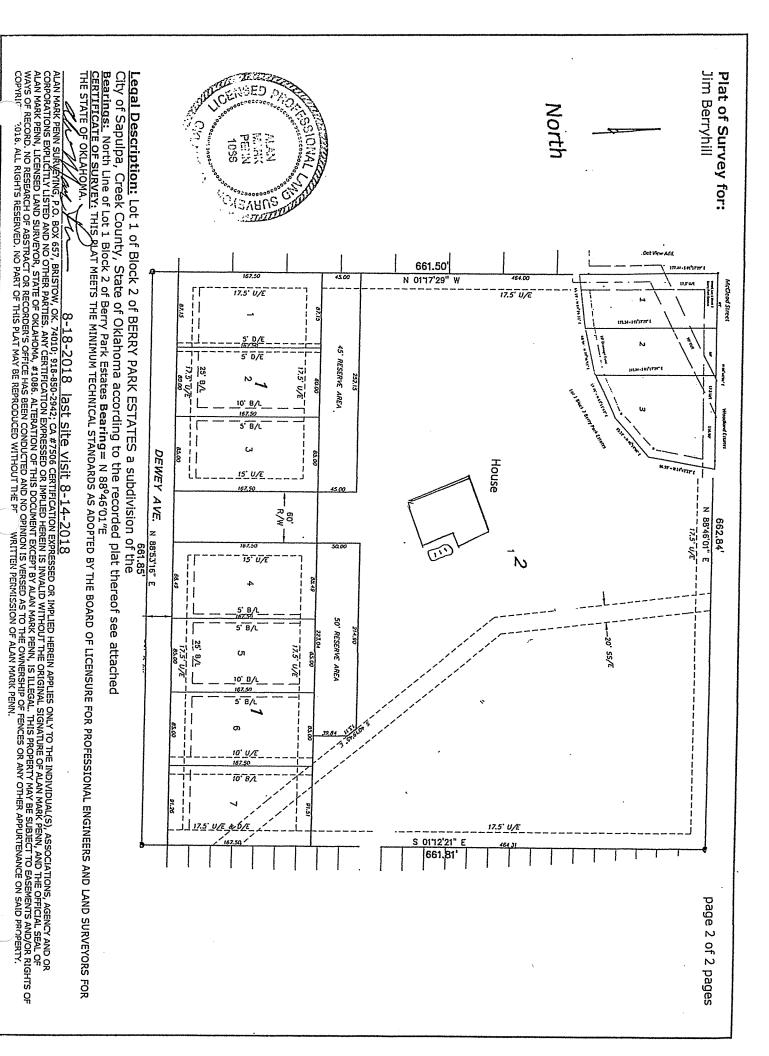


Looking East From McLeod

SECTION 2. That the City Clerk of the City of Sapulpa is hereby directed to make the proper changes upon the official zoning map of said City to show thereon the change of zone and district of the above described property.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. Dear David:

As we discussed recently, please consider this letter the formal request of my client, **Bryan B. Close L.L.C.**, for an ordinance of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma closing the portion of West 52nd Street that is situated within the municipal corporate limits of the City. My client is the owner of the lands on both sides of the street, and it appears that a portion of the street right-of-way may be situated inside a Sapulpa "fence line" annexation.

The street is a stub or "dead end" street that extends eastward from South 49th West Avenue. It is depicted on the 1946 subdivision plat of "M.A. Younkman's Subdivision," a copy of which is enclosed. The legal description of the street, which you may use for the closure ordinance, is the following:

All of that part of the right-of-way of West 52nd Street depicted on the Plat of M.A. Younkman's Subdivision dated 15 November 1946 and filed for record on 14 January 1949 in the Office of the County Clerk of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, recorded as Plat No. 1439, that is situated within the municipal corporate limits of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, the same being 25 feet in width, located generally between (on the North) Tracts 17 to 23 and (on the South) Tract 24 of M.A. Younkman's Subdivision.

The street is not used or required for county or municipal purposes or for the use of the holders of any franchise or anyone else having a special right or privilege granted by



ordinance or legislative enactment; in fact, the street has not been used by the public, or anyone besides my client, for many years and has not been maintained by the City or by Tulsa County. Accordingly, such street right-of-way is no longer required for public purposes, and it is necessary and expedient and in the public interest, for the health, welfare and best interests of the citizens of the City of Sapulpa, to manage and facilitate appropriate pedestrian and vehicular traffic flow, to facilitate the efficient provision and disposition of utility services, and to eliminate unnecessary maintenance, that the portion of the street right-of-way described above should be closed, discontinued and abandoned.

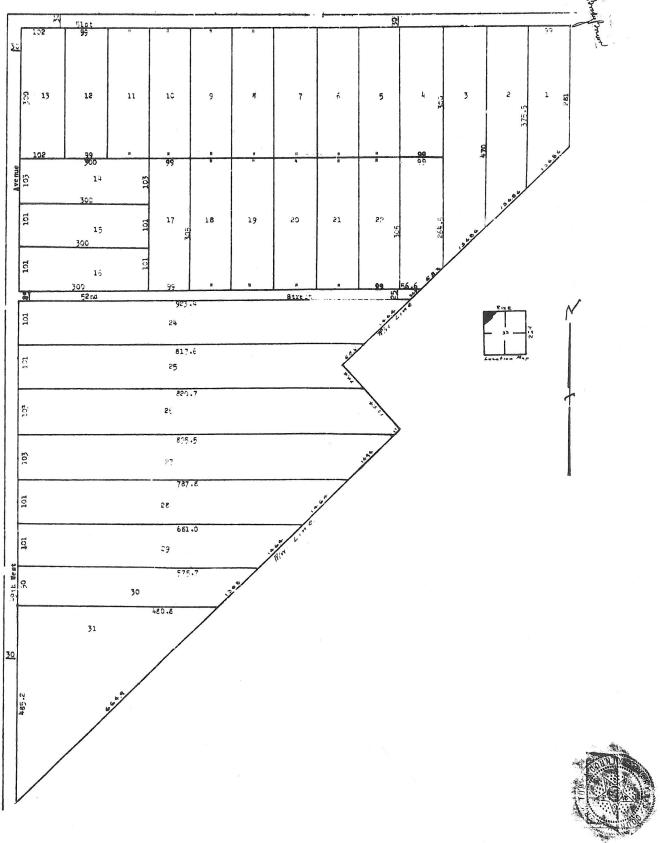

AN ORDINANCE CLOSING TO PUBLIC USE THAT PORTION OF WEST 52ND STREET LYING ADJACENT TO TRACTS 17 THROUGH 23 AND TRACT 24 OF THE M.A. YOUNKMAN'S SUBDIVISION, CITY OF SAPULPA, TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, CITY OF SAPULPA, OKLAHOMA:

<u>Section 1.</u> The M.A. Younkman's Subdivision, City of Sapulpa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, reflects the existence of a 25' dedicated roadway lying adjacent to Tracts 17 through 23 and Tract 24, M.A. Younkman's Subdivision, City of Sapulpa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, commonly known as West 52nd Street, according to the recorded plat thereof; The City has received a request from the owner of the adjacent property to formally close that portion to public use.

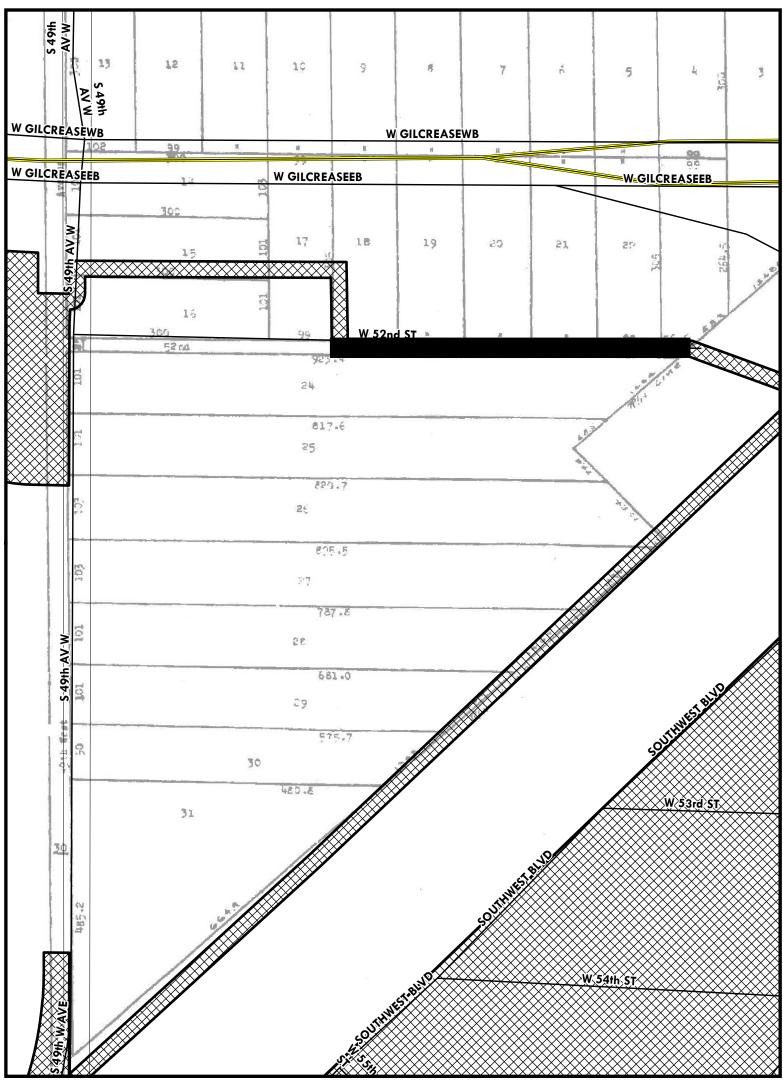

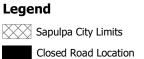

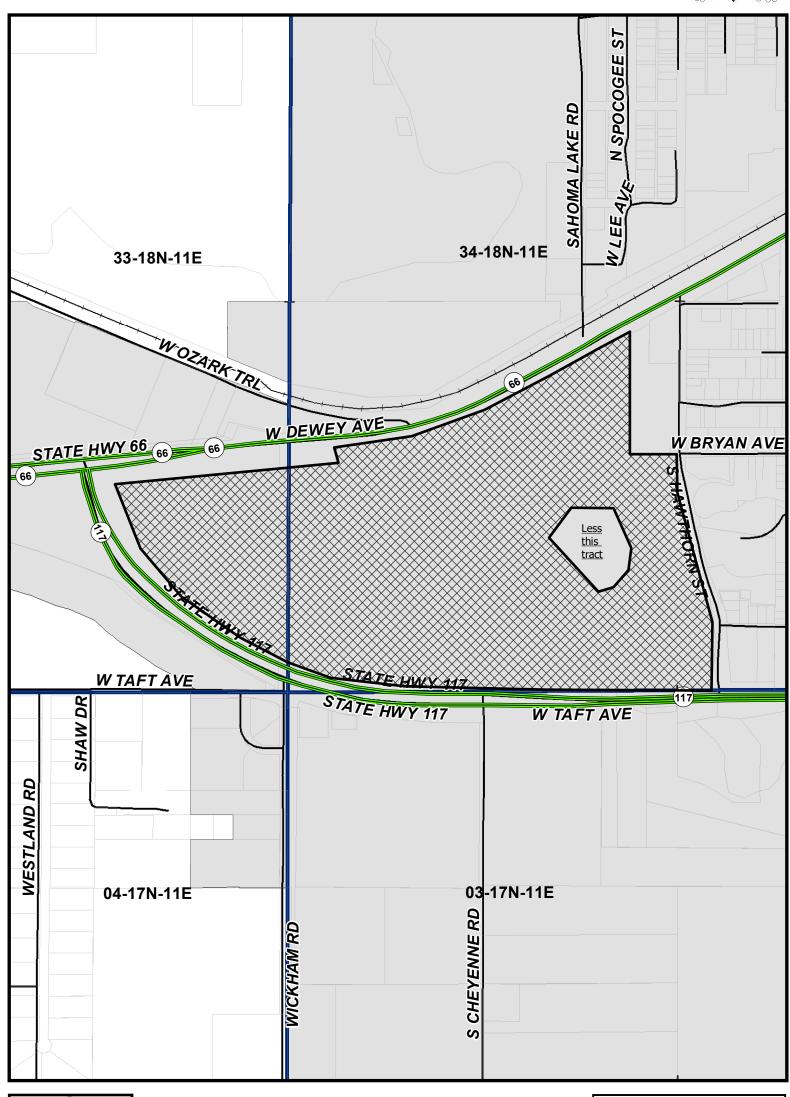
